

Instructions to the Author

The manuscript should be prepared in Microsoft Word format. Abstract should be submitted separately along with keywords. The full paper should also contain the abstract. The authors are instructed to follow standard IEEE format to prepare the manuscript. A sample paper of the IEEE format is attached herewith for convenience of the author. Please [click here](#) to download the sample paper of IEEE format.

The salient points of the formatting guidelines are given below.

- Your paper must use a page size corresponding to A4 which is 210mm (8.27") wide and 297mm (11.69") long. The margins must be set as follows:
 - Top = 19mm (0.75")
 - Bottom = 43mm (1.69")
 - Left = Right = 14.32mm (0.56")
- Your paper must be in two column format with a space of 4.22mm (0.17") between columns.
- Text Font of Entire Document
 - The entire document should be in Times New Roman. Other font types may be used if needed for special purposes.
- Recommended font sizes are as follows:
 - Title must be in 24 pt Regular font.
 - Author name must be in 11 pt Regular font. Authors' affiliation must be in 10 pt Italic.
 - email address must be in 9 pt Courier Regular font.
 - Other recommended font sizes are shown in the table below:

- **Section Headings:**
 - No more than 3 levels of headings should be used. All headings must be in 10pt font. Every word in a heading must be capitalized.
 - **Level-1 Heading:**
 - A level-1 heading must be in Small Caps, centred and numbered using uppercase Roman numerals. The two level-1 headings which must not be numbered are “Acknowledgment” and “References”.
 - **Level-2 Heading:**
 - A level-2 heading must be in Italic, left-justified and numbered using an uppercase alphabetic letter followed by a period.
 - **Level-3 Heading:**
 - A level-3 heading must be indented, in Italic and numbered with an Arabic numeral followed by a right parenthesis. The level-3 heading must end with a colon. The body of the level-3 section immediately follows the level-3 heading in the same paragraph. For example, this paragraph begins with a level-3 heading.

- **Figures and Tables**
 - Figures and tables must be centred in the column. Large figures and tables may span across both the columns. Any table or figure that takes up more than 1 column width must be positioned either at the top or at the bottom of the page.

- **References must follow the following formatting style:**

Basic format for books:

J. K. Author, “Title of chapter in the book,” in Title of His Published Book, xth ed. City of Publisher, (only U.S. State), Country: Abbrev. of Publisher, year, ch.x, sec. x, pp. xxx–xxx.

Examples:

- [1] G.O.Young,“Syntheticstructureofindustrial plastics,”in *Plastics*,2nded.,vol.3, J.Peters, Ed.New York, NY, USA: McGraw-Hill,1964,pp.15–64.

Basic format for reports:

J. K. Author, “Title of report,” Abbrev. Name of Co., City of Co., Abbrev. State, Country, Rep. xxx, year.

Examples:

- [2] E. E. Reber, R. L. Michell, and C. J. Carter, “Oxygen absorption in the

earth’s atmosphere,” Aerospace Corp., Los Angeles, CA, USA, Tech. Rep. TR-0200 (4230-46)-3, Nov. 1988.

Basic format for books (when available online):

J. K. Author, “Title of chapter in the book,” in Title of Published Book, xth ed. City of Publisher, State, Country: Abbrev. of Publisher, year, ch. x, sec. x, pp. xxx–xxx. [Online]. Available: <http://www.web.com>

Examples:

- [3] G. O. Young, “Synthetic structure of industrial plastics,” in *Plastics*, vol. 3, *Polymers of Hexadromicon*, J. Peters, Ed., 2nd ed. New York, NY, USA: McGraw-Hill, 1964, pp. 15-64. [Online]. Available: <http://www.bookref.com>.

Basic format for journals (when available online):

J. K. Author, "Name of paper," Abbrev. Title of Periodical, vol. x, no. x, pp. xxx-xxx, Abbrev. Month, year. Accessed on: Month, Day, year, DOI: 10.1109.XXX.123456, [Online].

Examples:

- [4] J. S. Turner, "New directions in communications," IEEE J. Sel. Areas Commun., vol. 13, no. 1, pp. 11-23, Jan. 1995.

Basic format for papers presented at conferences (when available online):

J.K. Author. (year,month). Title. presented at abbrev. conferencetitle. [Type of Medium]. Available: site/path/file

Example:

- [5] PROCESS Corporation, Boston, MA, USA. Intranets:Internet technologies deployed behind the firewall

for corporate productivity. Presented at INET96 Annual Meeting. [Online]. Available: <http://home.process.com/intranets/wp2.htm>

Basic format for computer programs and electronic documents (when available online):

Legislative body. Number of Congress, Session. (year, month day). Number of bill or resolution, Title. [Type of medium]. Available: site/path/file

NOTE:

ISO recommends that capitalization follow the accepted practice for the language or script in which the information is given.

Example:
